UCLA Radio Station Aids Disabled Ship

The short-wave radio station at UCLA, W6YRA, went to the aid of a vessel in difficulty yesterday and sent information which enabled the crew to repair the engine.

At 9:30 a.m. W6YRA picked up a call from SOBAJ, station on the 80-foot clipper Birca de Oro II, near Clipperton Island in the South Pacific. The Birca de Oro, with 13 people aboard, was bound to Clipperton Island to establish a radio station there when her diesel engine broke down.

Herb Epp, operator at UCLA, sent for Ray Hollup, diesel engine expert at the university. Hollup diagnosed the trouble with the Birca de Oro's engine and advised the crew how to make repairs. The two radio operators maintained contact for about three hours while the information was being relayed.
